Every year in March, CACCA hosts several Individual competitions in addition to the monthly interclub events. Here is the information you need to participate and the important date(s) for your preparations. First, with regard to the Postcard competition, The CACCA date is March 8. We will have our Mayslake competition at our meeting on march 3 with the same voting by those in attendance process. Please remember that all entries will go to CACCA, not only those that win at Mayslake. We've had very good success in this competition at CACCA in the past couple of years; let's keep it up with lots of entries. Be creative and remember, 'hand of man' rules do not apply.

The CACCA Salon is a much bigger and broader based event and is held on a date separate from the regular monthly meeting date, this year on March 15. This is a great chance to broaden your 'focus' from our regular 'no hand of man' competitions. All competition is individual and for all of the various digital categories, you do your own entry via the CACCA web site: http://caccaweb. com. Information is under the Salon tab. Digital competitions are available in Portrait, Nature, Photojournalism, 'regular Digital' (which means anything you wish to shoot and enter) and Creative Digital (where any/all of your Photoshop enhanced composites or dreams can be presented). Finally, for those of us who like to print, there are competitions in small and large sizes, 11 x 14 and 16 x 20 respectively. Categories are Color, Monochrome and Nature. 
Round Table February 3 Program
